

Changing Property Lines

This document is designed to provide a brief overview of Mount Holly Town and State of Vermont rules and regulations regarding changes to property lines. It is not a substitute for the documents or ordinances that are summarized here. Complete copies of forms and documents mentioned here are available from the Mount Holly Town Clerk. How it Works

Property boundary changes include line adjustments and subdivisions. If you are planning changes,

- Hire a Vermont licensed surveyor. (see <u>27 V.S.A. § 341</u>)
 You can find a list of active surveyors here: https://www.vsls.org/find-a-surveyor/
- You may wish to consult a lawyer to determine if you need any special permits.
- For subdivisions or substantial boundary line changes, follow the steps in the <u>Subdivision Guide</u>.
- An 18"×24" mylar copy of the survey is required for the official recording by the Town Clerk.
- Instruct your surveyor that they will also need to produce a .PDF copy of the resulting survey.
- Your surveyor is required to submit a copy of the survey to the Vermont Land Survey Library in <a href="https://pxp.ncbi.nlm.nc
