



Mount Holly is a town in Rutland County, Vermont, with a population of 1,385 (2020 census). Our town has a total area of 49.6 square miles, of which 0.4 square miles is water. We are Know for our long-lasting snow, and for Okerno Mountain, which straddies Mount Holly and our nearby neighbor to the east, Ludlow. There are four hamlets in Mount Holly, of which one is Belmont, a designated Village Center. We are a small town with deep roots in community.



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

MUNICIPAL PLANNING GRANT

in 2021, the Town of Mount Holly applied for and received a Municipal Planning Grant from the State of Vermont Agency of Commerce and Community Development. The Select Board contracted with Community Roots, LLC, led by Melissa Levy, to identify and understand community concerns related to housing, economic development, and public infrastructure.

A number of community members have volunteered to help guide the project and are chipping in to help keep costs down. Jeff Chase is the Municipal Authorizing Official for the Select Board. Jon McCann, the Chair of the Planning Commission, is helping with administration. Deeply engaged local citizens Andy Bolalek, Russ Garrow, Anna Hanson, Kevin Hollebeek, Lisa Kelley, David Martin, Jessica Metcalfe, and Faith Tempest have volunteered to share their expertise and help gulde the project.

The first task was to engage the community to help steer the grant objectives. A survey was conducted from November 1-30, 2022, via an online survey and a hard copy print survey. The online survey was hosted by Google Forms and linked from the Town website. The link to the survey was additionally distributed on the Newsflash email list each week, and a QR code was published in the November edition of the Chit Chat. Individuals shared the link in various other local community forums and on Facebook. Hardcopies were available for pickup and return at both the Town Office and the Town Library.

The response from you, the community, has been overwhelming! We received 172 responses, which is nearly 20% of the adult population. For comparison, many surveys are lucky if they get a 10% response rate. This is clear evidence of how deeply we care about our community.






7. How important are the following to you as to why you live in Mount Holly?






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
8. How important are the following to your rural Mount Holly lifestyle?






9. How do you rate the importance of these challenges facing Mount Holly over the next 5-10 years?



Septic Issues

There is a lot of overlap of well supply isolation zones and on-site septic systems within the village.

Would prefer to find an alternate septic solution which would avoid this.




Please note: Septic systems vary. Diagram is not to scale.






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


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


To offsite location down from village where there are acceptable soils.





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- Could help to support some additional local business growth;
- Grant programs available to assist town with this option;
- Would likely prioritize support for some limited commercial development and replacing failing systems first;
- Number of properties it could support is not yet known;
- First step would be an engineering feasibility study;








BELMONT VILLAGE PLAN







Senior Housing / Apartments

- Senior apartments and some <u>year-round</u> rental units for younger generations;
- Provides some generational diversity, socialization, people look after their neighbors, avoids isolation;
- Small, easy-to maintain cottages or apartments scaled to the Village in a compact, clustered design;
- Walking distance into village;
- Could be served by community septic.





- Relocate utility pole(s).










